



CHECK-IN/OUT TIMES: Check-in arrival time is no earlier than noon and departure check-out is 11 am. We cannot guarantee that every individual room will be ready before 3 pm but will do our best.

HORSES: The horses love to be petted and are all friendly and like treats. We just ask that all guests stay on the OUTSIDE of corrals, pens and pastures and all enclosures remain locked. This ensures your safety and that of our herd.

PETS: Well-behaved, potty-trained pets are welcome. It is a \$10/per day fee per pet. Please pick up pet waste in common areas. We reserve the right to ask you to leash or remove your pet from the property if it becomes dangerous to our livestock, disruptive or destructive.

PARKING: Vehicles may park at the main lodge circle or in the designated areas by the Bunkhouse, Chalet & cabins. Please do not block any roads. Please do not drive on walking paths or trails.

GAMES: We love for families to play games! Please keep all the game pieces together and in the correct boxes so future families can have the same fun. The same applies to DVD's.

SMOKING: Smoking is ok in designated outside areas and absolutely NO smoking in buildings. Please extinguish carefully as we are in a flammable area and dispose of butts in containers.

FIREWORKS/FIREARMS: We do not allow the shooting of fireworks or firearms on the property.

CAMPFIRES: Campfires are normally ok as we are on private land... unless we are in a Red Flag Warning. Please ask Joe or Dyan to make sure if you plan a campfire and make sure that a hose is on hand at the campfire circle. Campfires are only allowed in the designated campfire area. Propane grills and propane fires are ok in other areas as long as the space is clear of flammable items.

NEIGHBORS: We have neighbors and we respect their privacy. Please do not trespass on private property. Please keep quiet hours between 10 pm to 7 am.

PRIVATE AREAS: Please respect the areas marked "private" "storage" "equipment" or "maintenance". These areas are not for guest use. In emergency after hours, Joe and Dyan can be reached in the Lodge private living-quarters.

NATIONAL FOREST: There are two access points into the National Forest. If you would like to explore, please do so out of one of the two gates. Hikers, bikers or horses can all use the trails. Understand that there is wildlife in the forest. You may encounter elk, deer, coyotes, bears, mountain lions, javelina or wolves. Some of these animals, especially elk & deer share this property. Please stay back and let them have their space.

ATV's: ATV's are allowed but must maintain a speed of no more than 10 mph around the property and cannot access the National Forest out of the 2 gates. ATV's must go down the dirt road back to the highway and can access the forest via a motorized route. Our trails and our agreement with the Forest Service do not include motorized vehicles.

POOL TABLE: The wooden window shades must be lowered in order to protect the windows from damage when playing pool. Please do not set any food or liquid on the pool table.

ROOM KEYS: Each room must sign-in/sign-out to get/return the keys. There is a \$25 charge each lost room key.

WIFI: Wifi is available in the main lodge but it is limited in the rural backcountry. We ask that it is used only for work or group activities. If everyone logs on, there simply won't be any left

WARNING: This is an older property and we are making improvements but there could be hazards to watch out for such as broken glass, wires, metal etc in the ground, trees and branches not secure, stairs & handrails that we haven't addressed yet. Please be careful and keep an eye on your children. If you see an issue, please bring it to our attention.

Please treat the Aspen Lodge with respect as if it were your own home and if you need anything, Joe & Dyan would be happy to assist you. DIRECTIONS: 1 Co Rd 2325, Alpine, AZ 85920

There are multiple routes “up the mountain” depending on where you are coming from.

From TUCSON, most people take route 77 to Globe and then the 60 from Globe to Showlow and then to Springerville/Eager. Our closest town outside of Alpine is Springerville/Eager. There is a Safeway there, restaurants, pubs, hotels, a small airport and other amenities. (It also has the former ranch of John Wayne!) Alpine has a small market, auto repair, gas station, ranger station and a couple of restaurants. To get here from Springerville/Eager, you will head southeast on Hwy 180. Alpine is approx 27 miles from Springerville/Eager. Watch out for wildlife crossing the road during this stretch, especially at night. Once in Alpine, there is a gas station called the Tackle Shop on the right hand side of the highway. You will continue straight, passing the gas station and a donkey pasture. County Road 2325 is the first right after the donkey pasture. It is a well-maintained dirt road. You will pass several cabins so please drive slow. After the cabins, continue straight for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. You will come to the Aspen Lodge gate (which is open). Continue straight for 1000 more feet and the road will end at the Lodge. There is a big circular driveway for easy turnaround and you will check in here. This route takes about 4.5 hours.

The alternate route from TUCSON is to take the I-10 to Willcox and then the 191 through Safford. You will want to cut off the 191 to the 78 and go towards New Mexico/Mule Creek (unless you want to do the “scenic” route that continues up the 191 with about 300 beautiful curves. It is stunning but longer due to the terrain). At Mule Creek you can take the 180 north to Alpine. Once in Alpine, you will come to our one and only intersection in town, where hwy 191 and 180 meet. There is a gas station called the Tackle Shop. You will take a left here, passing the gas station and a donkey pasture. County Road 2325 is the first right after the donkey pasture. It is a well-maintained dirt road. You will pass several cabins so please drive slow. After the cabins, continue straight for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. You will come to the Aspen Lodge gate (which is open). Continue straight for 1000 more feet and the road will end at the Lodge. There is a big circular driveway for easy turnaround and you will check in here. The alternate route will take about 5 hours.

From PHOENIX, you will take the 202 Loop and then the 87 North toward Payson. In Payson, you will take a right onto Hwy 260 East toward Showlow. Once in Showlow, take a left onto Hwy 60 to Springerville/Eager. Our closest town outside of Alpine is Springerville/Eager. There is a Safeway there, restaurants, pubs, hotels a small airport and other amenities. (It also has the former ranch of John Wayne!) Alpine has a small market, auto repair, gas station, ranger station and a couple of restaurants. To get here from Springerville/Eager, you will head southeast on Hwy 180. Alpine is approx 27 miles from Springerville/Eager. Watch out for wildlife crossing the road during this stretch, especially at night. Once in Alpine, there is a gas station called the Tackle Shop on the right hand side of the highway. You will continue straight, passing the gas station and a donkey pasture. County Road 2325 is the first right after the donkey pasture. It is a well-maintained dirt road. You will pass several cabins so please drive slow. After the cabins, continue straight for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. You will come to the Aspen Lodge gate (which is open). Continue straight for 1000 more feet and the road will end at the Lodge. There is a big circular driveway for easy turnaround and you will check in here. This route is about 5 hours.

From FLAGSTAFF, take I-40 southeast toward Holbrook. In Holbrook (which is a cool old route 66 town) you will jog over to the 180 toward Springerville/Eager. Our closest town outside of Alpine is Springerville/Eager. There is a Safeway there, restaurants, pubs, hotels a small airport and other amenities. (It also has the former ranch of John Wayne!) Alpine has a small market, auto repair, gas station, ranger station and a couple of restaurants. To get here from Springerville/Eager, you will head southeast on Hwy 180. Alpine is approx 27 miles from Springerville/Eager. Watch out for wildlife crossing the road during this stretch, especially at night. Once in Alpine, there is a gas station called the Tackle Shop on the right hand side of the highway. You will continue straight, passing the gas station and a donkey pasture. County Road 2325 is the first right after the donkey pasture. It is a well-maintained dirt road. You will pass several cabins so please drive slow. After the cabins, continue straight for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. You will come to the Aspen Lodge gate (which is open). Continue straight for 1000 more feet and the road will end at the Lodge. There is a big circular driveway for easy turnaround and you will check in here. This route takes 3.5 hours.

From ALBUQUERQUE, head west on I-40 then south on the 117 to Quemado. In Quemado, take the 60 southwest toward Springerville/Eager. Our closest town outside of Alpine is Springerville/Eager. There is a Safeway there, restaurants, pubs, hotels a small airport and other amenities. (It also has the former ranch of John Wayne!) Alpine has a small market, auto repair, gas station, ranger station and a couple of restaurants. To get here from Springerville/Eager, you will head southeast on Hwy 180. Alpine is approx 27 miles from Springerville/Eager. Watch out for wildlife crossing the road during this stretch, especially at night. Once in Alpine, there is a gas station called the Tackle Shop on the right hand side of the highway. You will continue straight, passing the gas station and a donkey pasture. County Road 2325 is the first right after the donkey pasture. It is a well-maintained dirt road. You will pass several cabins so please drive slow. After the cabins, continue straight for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. You will come to the Aspen Lodge gate (which is open). Continue straight for 1000 more feet and the road will end at the Lodge. There is a big circular driveway for easy turnaround and you will check in here. This route takes about 4 hours.

From LAS CRUCES, take I-10 west to Deming. In Deming, take the 180 northwest through Silver City and up to Alpine, This is a nice route and will take about 4 hours. Once in Alpine, you will come to our one and only intersection in town, where hwy 191 and 180 meet. There is a gas station called the Tackle Shop. You will take a left here, passing the gas station and a donkey pasture. County Road 2325 is the first right after the donkey pasture. It is a well-maintained dirt road. You will pass several cabins so please drive slow. After the cabins, continue straight for $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. You will come to the Aspen Lodge gate (which is open). Continue straight for 1000 more feet and the road will end at the Lodge. There is a big circular driveway for easy turnaround and you will check in here.
